Procedures for inclusion in accepted list for
S.122A - Accepted Contractors for over-ground circular slurry/effluent stores.

Any company wishing to become accepted for the construction of over-ground circular slurry stores must provide the following information to the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food.

Details required:

1. Product(s) to be supplied.
2. Company Name.
3. Company address.
4. Contact name and telephone number.
5. Evidence of ISO 9001 certification for tank manufacturer.
6. Health and safety training documents.
7. Employers and public liability insurance.
8. Current C2 certificate or a tax clearance certificate from the Office of the Revenue Commissioners.
9. Drawings of product.
10. Full dimensions of products, height of panel, length of panel and thickness of paneling.
11. Full details of reinforcing used in products (thickness, vertical spacing, horizontal spacing, no of layers, concrete cover).
12. Full details of concrete mix used in production of product including, concrete strength, minimum cement content, water cement ratio, admixtures, fibres, aggregate size.
13. Evidence of certification to IS EN 206-1:2002 for plant producing concrete used in manufacture of wall panels. Certification is to be by a certified body accepted by The Department of Agriculture, Fisheries & Food (e.g. N.S.A.I., B.S.I., Q.S.R.M.C).
14. Details of sealant used between panels.
15. Drawings of base requirements.
16. Details of access ladders and platforms.
17. Guarantee given with the product.
18. Expected lifetime of the product.
19. Declaration that product will only be supplied to this standard.

Note: Items 11, 12 and 13 are only required where the circular store panels are of concrete construction

Note: This acceptance will last for 5 years, after a period of 5 years on the list, it will be required for companies to under go a renewal process which will include the resubmission of the above data and evidence of having remained certified to the relevant standards for the previous 5 years and evidence of having produced the product to the agreed standard.

Note: Under S.I. 101 of 2009 it is a legal requirement that **all** slurry, effluent and soiled water stores be constructed in accordance with the relevant Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food specification.
